Minutes of the 68th Annual General Meeting

Manly-Warringah Soccer Football Club Monday, 30th November, 2015

- 1.0 Meeting Opened: At 7.30pm by the Incumbent 2015 MWFA President, Mr Jeff Smit
- **2.0 Welcome:** to the 68th Annual General Meeting of the Manly Warringah Football Association Inc., by MWFA President, Mr Jeff Smit (EC), issued to all Life Members, Delegates and Guests. He made mention of MWFA Life Members present, namely Mesdames Linda Ward and Jacky Higgins as well as Messrs Don Gale, Warren Meppem, Ray Fanning, Keith Pester (EC) and Andrew Edwards (EC).
- 3.0 Attendance: Noted in the Attendance Book as 45 Members, Life Members and Guests.
- **4.0 Apologies:** Apologies were received from Mr David Wilson (EC with wife after her operation), Mr Rob Brennan (MWFRA), Mr Valentino Surjan (Pittwater RSL FC), Mr Alex Wise (Dee Why FC), Mr Ken Ashley (Manly Allambie United FC).
- **5.0 Minutes of the 6t**th **Annual General Meeting (Year 2014):** No amendments were noted so a Motion was moved by Mr Keith Pester (LM & EC), seconded by Mr Richard Wright (Seaforth FC) and passed unanimously that these Minutes, as shown in the 2015 Annual Report document, be accepted as a true and accurate record.
- 5.1 Business Arising from the Above Minutes: nil was forthcoming
- 6.0 Annual Report Document: Mr Smit (EC) offered the 2015 Annual Report document for perusal. He said key items such as the Honoraria were recommended to remain as for 2015 Year and sought a motion to that end. This was forthcoming from Mr Warren Meppem (LM), seconded by Mr Neville Drake (Belrose Terrey Hills SC) and passed unanimously. Next Mr Smit spoke on other key items in the AR namely the matters which had been planned and executed during the past year and where planned for implementation in the near future. He offered his Report wording to all present to show the work completed and still to be enacted. Mr Smit said the year 2015 had seemed quite lengthy in its conducted business but had proven quite rewarding. He said his hope for all matters at present in negotiation was for these successfully to fall into place for the benefit of MW Football members. Other sections of the AR document were highlighted with their page position in said document. In particular, Mr Smit thanked the Warringah Council, Forest Killarney FC and Club and past members for their parts in the development of two new synthetic Football pitches opened mid-year at Melwood Oval, Forestville. These were noted as helping FKFC and the MWFA to conduct Football matches even despite rain. Again, our MWFA Office Staff members were thanked for such continuing and excellent work in making our part of Football administration run so well. Firstly, he praised Mr Jeremy Toivonen, MWFA General Manager, for again overseeing the professional, 'in-house' preparation of the Annual Report document. Next Mr Smit thanked the other tireless Office Staff team members in Mrs Lee-Anne Sestanovich (MWFA Admin Manager), Ms Angela Crandell and Ms Louise Blair (vital Staff Members) for their outstanding business acumen throughout 2015 and in the preparation of the 2015 Annual

Following this, Mr Smit thanked all members of the MWFA Management and Executive Committees, plus various MWFA Sub-Committees, for their continued thoroughness and cooperative efforts, on behalf of the MWFA, during 2015. He added his thanks to all associated with the MWFA Member Clubs for dealing so well with their part of MW Football.

- **6.1** Mr Smit congratulated the 2015 Football NSW State Cups' and Champion of Champions Tournaments' participants and officials plus eventual winners, as shown in the Annual Report.
- **7.0 Motion to Accept Annual Report:** Mr Smit called for the Annual Report document to be moved into acceptance. This Motion was forthcoming from Mrs Linda Ward (LM), Seconded by Mr Don Gale (LM) and accepted unanimously.
- **8.0 Treasurer's Report:** Mr Smit invited Mr Robert Carollo (Treasurer MWFA) to speak on financial matters in the Annual Report. Mr Carollo advised that the MWFA's full audited statement had been provided for the 2015 Annual Report for the sixth year in a row, with financial documentation dated 20th November, 2015, for the Financial Year ended 30th September, 2015. This documentation signed for the CKC Corporate Services, Chartered Accountants, was noted as the final documentation in the Annual Report document. He remarked that the 'MWFA Annual Treasurer's Report and Financial Statements' were again completed according to the Companies Act of NSW and as advised by our Auditors. Mr Carollo briefly outlined the documentation.

- **8.1** Mr Smit thanked Mr Carollo for his work as Treasurer, over the past two years, and said we sadly had to say farewell to him as his own company business had to assume more of his time. Mr Carollo was thanked for his efficient business acumen. This was followed by applause.
- **9.0 Budget for 2015:** The comprehensive Budget Summary offered by Mr Carollo was once again announced as extremely strong with regards to sporting organisations, when observed as a total picture. He offered thanks to all members on as well as our Office Staff who played a part in making this so. Next he said that even though there was a deficiency in some figures, the purpose was to spend the amount on development with grounds and the like. He remarked that the figures shown at the recent Budget and Policy Meeting had seen minor 'rearrangement'. Next he said there was again need to 'dip into the money' from one area to transfer to another for efficient management. Mr Carollo announced that the MWFA was in a position to do new programmes and support all MWFA Clubs. Also announced was that the MWFA had a substantive financial capital to exploit in the next few years. Then Mrs Linda Ward (LM) queried the Coaching Development figures and Mr Smit assisted by saying that the MWFA was continuing to subsidise that area.
- 9.1 Mr Carollo followed the above statements with his Motion to Accept the Budget, which was seconded by Mr Edwards (LM & EC) and carried unanimously.
- 10.0 Hon Auditor: Next enacted was a vote to accept the 2014 Auditor ('CKC Accountants') again as the Honorary Auditor firm for 2015. The Motion was moved by Mr Smit (EC), seconded by Mr Edwards (LM & EC) and passed unanimously.
- 11.0 Honoraria: The Honoraria within the Budget were reminded as previously tabled for adoption earlier in this Meeting. It was again said that the Honoraria for 2016 would remain as for the Years 2014 and 2015. Mr Smit stated Mr Meppem had moved previously the Acceptance Motion for the Honoraria remaining at the 2015 rate. Also it was stated that Mr Neville Drake (BTHSC) had seconded that Motion which had been passed unanimously.
- **12.0 Meritorious Service and Other Distinguished Awards** (citations being available for viewing and/or a copy obtained from the MWFA Office):
- 12.1 Football NSW Award for Service to Football 2014: Mr Ed Neill had been nominated by the EC of the MWFA for this Award, was duly presented with this Award at the recent and appropriate FNSW Meeting, was introduced with this Award tonight and had his achievements outlined. Mr Smit's outline of Mr Neill's achievements was displayed on the parchment read out for Mr Neill. Applause followed from those assembled.
- **12.2 Meritorious Service Awards:** Mr Smit introduced the MWFA Meritorious Service Awardees and asked Mr Fanning to present an award to each recipient in turn, with Mr Toivonen to photograph the occasions. Applause followed each presentation. There were three awardees presented, as follows: Mrs Maria Jones (Mosman FC), Mr Ludo Ledieu (Curl Curl YC/FC), Mr Sam Femia (Brookvale FC).
- 13.0 MWFA Life Membership: Mr Smit announced there were was one Life Membership being awarded this year which was to Mrs Rhonda Ferguson (the MWFA Women's Co-ordinator) who after 13 consecutive years of MWFA service has had to step down due to business commitments. The outline of Mrs Ferguson's service record was quite considerable. After the announcement, applause followed and Mrs Ferguson's sincere thanks were given to those with whom she had associated over her time at the MWFA and with her Service time at her Clubs both beforehand and consecutively.
- 14.0 Mr Jeff Smit, Outgoing 2015 President, concluded the MWFA Year 2015 Business, announced the Election of 2016 Office Bearers, invited Mr Ray Fanning (Life Member) to Chair the Election, called upon all 2015 Office Bearers to stand down and vacated the Chair.
- **14.1** Mr Fanning took the Chair and thanked all members of the 2015 MWFA Committee, especially Mr Smit, for again conducting MWFA business most efficiently. He added his thanks to the MWFA Office Staff Members for their effective business acumen during the 2015 Year on behalf of the Manly Warringah Football Association Inc.
- **14.2** He sought a Motion to elect Mr Tony Davies as Acting Secretary to take the Minutes during the Election. This was moved by Mr Smit (EC), seconded by Mr Pester (LM & EC) and passed unanimously.
- **14.3** Next, Mr Fanning announced all Positions were vacant and that there were candidates for most positions, as shown in the Annual Report namely one nominee per position advertised with no nominee for the role of Treasurer;

- 14.4 Mr Fanning then proceeded to announce that as only one candidate had been received for each of the advertised roles, with one as nil nomination, he was obliged to ask each candidate if he or she would stand for the position as nominated. - 14.5 Then Mr Fanning remarked that the role of Treasurer was crucial but no one proceeded to stand from the Floor so he asked for Clubs to pursue this matter urgently. There was a remark that a Club member had stated his possibly standing in the near future and that this was being negotiated at present. The outcome to fill the vacancy would see a member elected to 'Fill a Casual Vacancy' as Treasurer and the next Council would be asked to endorse said election.
- **14.6** Mr Fanning finally reaffirmed the elected members of the Executive and Management Committee, by reading the list follows:

14.7 - Election of Office Bearers - Executive and Management Committee:

President - Mr Jeff Smit

Treasurer - No member yet nominated - this matter urgently being pursued

- 14.8 Mr Fanning, in an aside, spoke on the MWFA having continued to conduct its business most efficiently and successfully and thanked all involved from club level to the MWFA Committees, Sub-Committees and Office Staff Members.
- **14.9** Then he expressed his thanks to Mr Davies, as Acting Secretary, for taking the Minutes of the 2014 AGM, thanked the MWFA members for inviting him to the 2015 AGM and for the opportunity to both Chair and address the Meeting.
- **14.10** Finally, Mr Fanning called upon the Elected President for 2016, Mr Jeff Smit, to assume the Office of President for 2016 with the Manly Warringah Football Association. Mr Fanning wished everyone associated with the MWFA the best for the coming festive season as well as the 2016 Football season and vacated the Chair. This action was followed by applause from the Floor.

15.0 - New President Assuming Office

Mr Smit then assumed the Office of President for 2016, thanked Mr Fanning for his kind words and for Conducting the Election of 2016 MWFA Office Bearers. He thanked Mr Davies for being the Acting Secretary and taking the Minutes. Next he called upon all Officers elected for 2016 to take Office, which duly occurred. In particular, he thanked Mr Fanning for the many tireless years of service with the MWFA (including being his predecessor as President) and his friendship.

16.0 - Elections of Other Office Bearers, Sub-Committee Members and Delegates

Mr Smit sought members to stand for the other Offices and Delegates with the following elected:

Player Grading Sub-Committee: Messrs Jeff Smit, David Wilson (alternating Chairpersons), Mark Gale, James Raphael, Mark Femia with Mrs Linda Ward.

General Purpose Tribunal (new body): Messrs Richard Wright, Neville Drake, Roy Sider, Scott Larson. Mrs Ward queried what if a perceived 'conflict of interest, might be present where a member had to be brought before the SPT, to which Mr Smit said the same procedure for any perceived conflict of interest would be enacted as stated in the MWFA Constitution. Mr Smit said a person with legal expertise would be sought for the Chairperson role ASAP. Also Mr Smit said this body would play a role similarly to that of the FNSW SPT.

MWFA Competitions Sub-Committee: Mr Andrew Edwards (Chairperson), plus a member from each of the following Clubs – Pittwater RSLFC, Beacon Hill FC, Seaforth FC, Belrose Terrey Hills SC, Manly Vale FC and Wakehurst FC (these Clubs to forward names ASAP to MWFA Office)

Congratulations were offered by Mr Smit to all the above members who had been nominated and elected in the roles and to all the Club Office Bearers for volunteering their services on behalf of the code of Football with their respective Clubs.

17.0 - Election of Public Officer:

Mr Smit then stated Mr Jeremy Toivonen had been nominated and seconded as the Public Officer for the MWFA so he was duly elected unopposed. Applause followed this statement.

- 18.0 Affiliation of Clubs: Mr Toivonen stated all Clubs had affiliated.
- **19.0 Notice of Motion:** Mr Edwards said that there were Proposed Constitution Changes in the process of being listed for determination with some tightening of the MWFA Constitution to fit new legal guidelines and these would be handed to Clubs ASAP in January, 2016. He proposed a Council of Clubs Special General Meeting to consider these, with said SGM to be held immediately prior to the February Monthly General Meeting of Clubs on Monday, 1st February, 2016, starting at 7.30pm. This Motion was seconded by Mr Davies and passed unanimously. Again it was stressed that Clubs would have further Notification early in 2016 of the business to be discussed at the SGM.

20.0 - General Business:

- 20.1 The 2016 Budget Mr Smit said the Budget as tabled might have to have some tweaking to cover minor items but would be substantially as tabled tonight. There was mention that the AL1 players would now come under the PL legal documentation and treatment with forms to be modified ASAP to reflect same. Mrs Ward queried extra fees mentioned in the Budget and Mr Toivonen explained the intricacies of fine-tuning the Budget from time to time and explained where extra amounts shown would have been determined;
- **20.2 PL and AL 1 Teams Moving Under the Same Legal Documentation –** Mr Smit again explained the legal matters to do with players and teams being registered with consequences if such not carried out to the satisfaction of MWFA members who have a legal background and act as advisors. Mrs Ward queried some matters and Mr Smit outlined why these two areas of competition had been changed. There was a Motion by Mr Pester, seconded by Mr Ross Downie (BTHSC) to adopt the new procedures. This was passed unanimously. Mr Roy Sider queried what documentation was needed at MWFA Office by 11th December.
- **20.3 MWFA Website** Mr Ed Neill queried the effectiveness of the MWFA website at present and Mr Toivonen said several issues had developed, which he also had observed and which would be righted ASAP in the New Year with new formatting.
- **20.4 2016 Annual General Meeting –** Mr Smit announced the date was tentatively set as Monday, 28th November, 2015.
- **21.0 Meeting Closure:** Mr Smit thanked all for attending and closed the 2015 Annual General Meeting at 8.10pm, mentioning the efficient business practice adopted tonight and wishing all a Merry Christmas plus a Happy and Prosperous New Year. He invited all to the first 2016 Council of Clubs Monthly General Meeting on Monday, 1st February 2016, starting tentatively at 8.00pm, following the Special GM at 7.30pm. Finally, he asked all present to stay for some refreshments to end a busy yet successful year 2015. Thereupon, Mr Smit closed the AGM for 2015.

1 Accounting policies

(a) General information

The financial statements cover Manly Warringah Football Association Inc as an individual entity. Manly Warringah Football Association Inc is an association incorporated in New South Wales under the Associations Incorporation Act 2009.

(b) Basis of preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, Reduced Disclosure Requirements and the Associations Incorporation Act 2009. The association is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

(c) Comparatives

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

(d) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less which are convertible to a known amount of cash and subject to an insignificant risk of change in value, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

(e) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value as indicated less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than the estimated recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to the estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses are recognised in profit or loss or as a revaluation decrease if the impairment losses relate to a revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that the future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably.

 - (e) Property, plant and equipment continued

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over their useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
Plant and Equipment	25 %
Motor Vehicles	15 %
Furniture and equipment	25 %

The assets' residual values, depreciation methods and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

(f) Employee benefits

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

(g) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

(h) Income taxes

The entity is a non profit organisation established to provide sporting facilities and is exempt from income tax under section 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act (Cth) 1997 as amended.

(i) Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Revenue from the rendering of services is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

 - (j) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

(k) Adoption of new and revised accounting standards

During the current year, the Association adopted all of the new and revised Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations applicable to its operations which became mandatory.

The adoption of these Standards has impacted the recognition, measurement and disclosure of certain transactions. The following is an explanation of the impact the adoption of these Standards and Interpretations has had on the financial statements of Manly Warringah Football Association Inc.

(I) New accounting standards for application in future periods

The AASB has issued new, revised and amended standards and interpretations that have mandatory application dates for future reporting periods. The Association has decided against early adoption of these standards. The Committee Members do not believe that these recently issued, revised or amended standards will have significant impact on the Association's financial reporting during the period of initial application.

Specific financial risk exposures and management

The main risks the association is exposed to through its financial instruments are liquidity risk, credit risk and interest rate risk.

(a) Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk arises from the possibility that the Association might encounter difficulty in settling its debts or otherwise meeting its obligations related to financial liabilities. The Association manages risk through the following mechanisms:

- preparing forward looking cash flow analysis in relation to its operational, investing and financial activities;
- maintaining a reputable credit risk profile;
- managing credit risk related to financial assets;
- only investing surplus cash with major financial institutions; and
- comparing the maturity profile of financial liabilities with the realisation profile of financial assets.

(b) Credit risk

Exposure to credit risk relating to financial assets arises from the potential non performance by counter parties of contract obligations that could lead to a financial loss to the association.

Credit risk is managed through the maintenance of procedures (such procedures include the utilisation of systems for approval, regular monitoring of exposures and monitoring of the financial stability of significant customers and counter parties) ensuring to the extent possible, that customers and counter parties to transactions are of sound credit worthiness. Such monitoring is used in assessing receivables for impairment. Credit terms are generally 30 days from the invoice date.

Risk is also minimised through investing surplus funds in financial institutions that maintain a high credit rating.

Credit risk exposures

The maximum exposure to credit risk by class of recognised financial assets at balance date, excluding the value of any collateral or other security held, is equivalent to the carrying value and classification of those financial assets (net of any provisions) as presented in the balance sheet.

There is no collateral held by the association securing trade and other receivables.

The association has no significant concentration of credit risk with any single counter party or group of counter parties. Trade and other receivables that are neither past due or impaired are considered to be of high credit quality.
