

## JUDICIARY REPORT

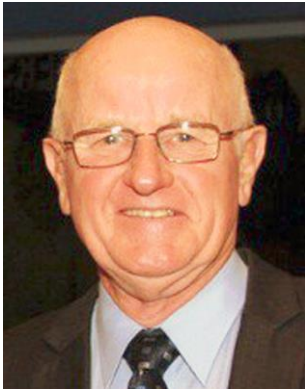
Firstly thanks to the panel, namely David Wilson, Cas Greco, Tony Cavallieri, Angie Carey, and Wayne Terry, and to the representative from the referees Craig McBernie.

There will be some changes to the structure of the judiciary next season in line with the Association changing to a company and a board structure instead of an Executive and Management committee, details will be sent out when the conversion is finalised.

As has been the case for a number of years the abuse of match officials is the most prevalent offense coming before the judiciary, and this need to be addressed by the judiciary and your association. There are already lengthy suspensions being imposed, but the message is not getting through to the players and team officials.

The Association agreed during the season to publish suspensions each week on the web site, and maybe this will make players aware of the seriousness of being sent off for abuse of match officials, and the lengthy suspensions imposed. The judiciary has a range of the number of matches it can apply and they may start to go to the maximum rather than the lesser sentences to try and curb this behaviour. The 10 minute sin bin for dissent is working well, and will continue to become more common in the future as more referees use this penalty.

On behalf of the Judiciary panel, I wish everyone a happy Christmas and hope to see you all next season, (but not at the judiciary),

- Y1 – Is guilty of unsporting behaviour
- Y2 – Shows dissent by word or action (sin bin)
- Y3 – Persistently infringes the laws of the game
- Y4 – Delays the restart of play
- Y5 – Failed to respect the required distance when play is restarted with a corner kick, or throw in
- Y6 – Enters or re-enters the field of play without the referee's permission
- Y7 – Deliberately leave the field of play without the referee's permission

**7. Presentation of Meritorious Service Awards and Football NSW State Awards**

**7.1 Richard Hooker – Football NSW State Award**

Richard Hooker has been a club stalwart for the Collaroy-Cromer Strikers Football Club since its creation in 1994.

But even before that Richard was prominent in community sport and worked tirelessly on the Cromer football club committee.

During the past 24 years Richard has served the merged entity, Collaroy-Cromer Strikers club in a wide range of key positions.

Some of these have ranged from Men's vice-President to club Registrar. Richard has also worked as Gear Steward, senior men's teams co-ordinator, team manager for numerous teams, Manly-Warringah Football Association delegate and competition director of the Sydney-wide competition, Strikers' Cup. He is also a life member of Collaroy Cromer Strikers FC.

However, it's in the area of competition organiser that Richard is best known.

He was integral in starting the CC Strikers inaugural summer six-a-side competition in 1977, a competition that, from humble origins, became one of the best-known summer sport competitions on the Northern Beaches.

From its inception, Richard ran this competition almost single-handedly,. It's booming popularity underlining the community demand for small-sided games on the northern beaches.

In 2012, CC Strikers and Manly United forged a partnership and the Manly-Warringah Summer Six-a-Side competition was created with Richard Hooker as tournament director.

Since that time this summer competition has gone from strength to strength and now involves more than 340 teams and 2750 players.

It is played on the artificial turf under lights at Cromer Park and provides a much-needed healthy sporting outlet for players from under five to over fifty.

## **7.2 David Lavings - Meritorious Service Award**

Curl Curl Youth Club would like to nominate David Lavings for a Meritorious Service Award. David has played at Curl Curl since 2008, starting in AL, moving to O35 and now playing O45. He also coached his son's junior team for 5 years and for 3 of these years was also the team manager. In 2009 our club was struggling for volunteers and a call was put out to all members to attend a crisis meeting to address this. David answered this call, becoming Vice President in 2009 and 2010. He then took on the President role in 2011 where he continues to this day. David's strong networks and links within the community have been invaluable and he has been a vocal and able advocate for the club at MWFA, on council committees and with local government. David was the main force behind the installation of lights at Abbott Rd – he organised the plans, the DA and obtained grants to fund the installation. More recently he has led the push for Curl Curl Youth Club to upgrade the facilities at Abbott Rd and get a proper clubhouse, which is now at DA stage, and he was also instrumental in forming an AL1 team in 2017. Each end-of-season Junior Presentation Day our club collects discarded kit and soccer boots and David, who works regularly in Fiji, takes these items to distribute to Fijian communities. David was voted Club Person of the Year in 2010.



### **7.3 Dusan Rakic - Meritorious Service Award**

Brookvale football club would like to nominate MR DUSAN RAKIC for the meritorious service award, Dusan has been involved with Brooky fc in either a playing and an off field role for the last 15 years. Dusan's love of the game initially saw him become a team coach or manager and player from 2003 until today. From 2003 to now he either coached or managed teams from u/16 to seniors.

He is now for the 3rd year the gear steward for our premier league men squad which entails long hours during the week and weekends while still trying to play the occasional game for his o/45 team. Although Dusan playing career at Brooky is quite outstanding its his off field role that requires some sort of recognition. This includes , over 15 years;

- \* Committee member from 2011 progressing to senior vice president and a member of the clubs executive committee over the last 3 years
- \* Team referee for his O/45 side whenever he is available, he has been a team referee for many years
- \* Since the club has growing in numbers Dusan has always made available when ever asked
- \* Dusan has assisted club over many years with preseason major clean out of grahams res dressing rooms and canteen
- \* Bagging of playing gear for all our teams prior to season starting

For the past 10 years Keith has been the patron of Manly Vale FC. He has recently been coaching a number of Manly Vale Women's teams as well as helping develop the skills of his grandchildren. Keith is passionate in his recollection of the club and areas football history and will happily engage with anyone on his this his favourite topic. Manly Vale FC is very fortunate to have the contribution of Keith and is proud to nominate him for the MWFA Meritorious Service award.

### **7.6 Neil Blundell - Meritorious Service Award**

### **7.7 James Raphael - Meritorious Service Award**

Both Ed and Col Pithis worked tirelessly to get this done. During his tenure the demountable building was put at Lionel Watts as a Club Canteen and Meeting place. During these times, Ed continued the tradition of opening his house on Friday nights for Coaches and



Managers to collect information and socialize to give a true Club spirit. Ed Neil was awarded Life Membership of Wakehurst Football Club in 1997.

Manly Warringah Football Association- Ed's time at Wakehurst was inter-twined with MWFA. From approximately 1990, Ed developed a computerized Registration System for MWFA and its Clubs. Ed maintained this program for the Association and its Clubs until the introduction of "My Football Club" in 2006. In 1997, he also developed a system to assist the Referee's with 'payments for games covered' and in 2000, he incorporated the MWFA System into 'i-sport' which remained in place until the introduction of 'My Football Club' in 2006.

Ed served on the Management Committee in 1992 and 1993 as Vice-President of Sub Juniors. He was also honoured with the MWFA Meritorious Award in 2004.

Ed's involvement and passion for the Appeals Committee is legendary dating back to 1996, giving 22 years and the last 8yrs as Chairman.

In 2015, Ed was awarded a 'Football NSW State Award' for services to football. This award was in recognition of his tireless efforts and services to football in their local community. A Player may be removed from the Club's Graded Player list if he/she leaves a club in abnormal circumstances provided he/she has played less than 5 games for the club in an MWFA recognised competition. The circumstances must be approved by the PGC.

Further initiatives such as a PL swap programme with the adjoining KDFRA, the introduction of a Level 2 Assessor, who is also a State League Referee, and the use of videoing referee games, have all been made during Rob's term. This has exposed referees to wider experiences and education in the pursuit of the highest standards possible

Also at Junior levels, Rob has introduced and overseen a mentoring programme for encouragement & education, in conjunction with a progression path for experienced juniors such that in 2018 a number of young senior referees progressed to refereeing our highest levels of PL & AL1.

Referee training nights at Cromer Park and a NSW FFA approved Fitness Test, which is mandatory for refereeing PL, AL1 & U18/1 levels, have all been introduced for improved knowledge and fitness.

Rob has led the progression of refereeing in the Manly Warringah association with vision, determination & sheer hard work. Rob leaves very big shoes to fill.

**Note 1. General information**

The financial statements cover Manly Warringah Football Association Inc as an individual entity. The financial statements are presented in Australian dollars, which is Manly Warringah Football Association Inc's functional and presentation currency.

Manly Warringah Football Association Inc is a not-for-profit incorporated association incorporated in New South Wales under the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) 2009, registered and domiciled in Australia.

The financial statements were authorised for issue on \_\_\_\_ November 2019.

**Note 2. Significant accounting policies**

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

**New or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted**

The association has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

**Basis of preparation**

These general purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB'), New South Wales legislation the Associations Incorporation Act 2009 and associated regulations, as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

*Historical cost convention*

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

*Critical accounting estimates*

The preparation of the financial statements requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgement in the process of applying the association's accounting policies. The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements, are disclosed in note 3.

**Revenue recognition**

The association recognises revenue as follows:

*Revenue from contracts with customers*

Revenue is recognised at an amount that reflects the consideration to which the association is expected to be entitled in exchange for transferring goods or services to a customer. For each contract with a customer, the association: identifies the contract with a customer; identifies the performance obligations in the contract; determines the transaction price which takes into account estimates of variable consideration and the time value of money; allocates the transaction price to the separate performance obligations on the basis of the relative stand-alone selling price of each distinct good or service to be delivered; and recognises revenue when or as each performance obligation is satisfied in a manner that depicts the transfer to the customer of the goods or services promised.

Variable consideration within the transaction price, if any, reflects concessions provided to the customer such as discounts, rebates and refunds, any potential bonuses receivable from the customer and any other contingent events. Such estimates are determined using either the 'expected value' or 'most likely amount' method. The measurement of variable consideration is subject to a constraining principle whereby revenue will only be recognised to the extent that it is highly probable that a significant reversal in the amount of cumulative revenue recognised will not occur. The measurement constraint continues until the uncertainty associated with the variable consideration is subsequently resolved. Amounts received that are subject to the constraining principle are recognised as a refund liability.

*Sale of goods*

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point in time when the customer obtains control of the goods, which is generally at the time of delivery.

**Note 2. Significant accounting policies (continued)**

*Rendering of services*

Revenue from rendering of services is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

*Interest*

Interest revenue is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method. This is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and allocating the interest income over the relevant period using the effective interest rate, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to the net carrying amount of the financial asset.

*Other revenue*

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

**Income tax**

As the association is a tax exempt institution in terms of subsection 50-10 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

**Current and non-current classification**

Assets and liabilities are presented in the statement of financial position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is classified as current when: it is either expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in the association's normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting period; or the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period. All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current when: it is either expected to be settled in the association's normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting period; or there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period. All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

**Cash and cash equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with financial institutions, other short-term, highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

**Trade and other receivables**

Trade receivables are initially recognised at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any allowance for expected credit losses. Trade receivables are generally due for settlement within 30 days.

The association has applied the simplified approach to measuring expected credit losses, which uses a lifetime expected loss allowance. To measure the expected credit losses, trade receivables have been grouped based on days overdue.

Other receivables are recognised at amortised cost, less any allowance for expected credit losses.

**Property, plant and equipment**

Plant and equipment is stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

Depreciation is calculated on a straight-line basis to write off the net cost of each item of property, plant and equipment (excluding land) over their expected useful lives as follows:

Computer equipment	10% - 25%
Furniture and equipment	10% - 25%
Plant and equipment	25%
Motor vehicles	15%

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each reporting date.

**Note 2. Significant accounting policies (continued)**

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when there is no future economic benefit to the association. Gains and losses between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds are taken to profit or loss. Any revaluation surplus reserve relating to the item disposed of is transferred directly to retained profits.

**Trade and other payables**

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. Due to their short-term nature they are measured at amortised cost and are not discounted. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

**Employee benefits**

*Short-term employee benefits*

Liabilities for wages and salaries, including non-monetary benefits, annual leave and long service leave expected to be settled wholly within 12 months of the reporting date are measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liabilities are settled.

*Other long-term employee benefits*

The liability for annual leave and long service leave not expected to be settled within 12 months of the reporting date are measured at the present value of expected future payments to be made in respect of services provided by employees up to the reporting date using the projected unit credit method. Consideration is given to expected future wage and salary levels, experience of employee departures and periods of service. Expected future payments are discounted using market yields at the reporting date on national government bonds with terms to maturity and currency that match, as closely as possible, the estimated future cash outflows.

*Defined contribution superannuation expense*

Contributions to defined contribution superannuation plans are expensed in the period in which they are incurred.

**Goods and Services Tax ('GST') and other similar taxes**

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the tax authority is included in other receivables or other payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to the tax authority, are presented as operating cash flows.

Commitments and contingencies are disclosed net of the amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the tax authority.

**Note 3. Critical accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions**

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements. Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgements, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and on other various factors, including expectations of future events, management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. There are no critical accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions that are likely to affect the current or future financial years.
