- Cromer Strikers Soccer Club and Collaroy Plateau Youth Club merged in 1995 to form Collaroy Cromer Strikers Football Club.
- Pittwater was formed in 1964 as a soccer section of the Pittwater RSL Youth Club. In 1966 the Football Section became a separate entity - what is now Pittwater RSL FC.
- Harbord Diggers Soccer Club (founded 1947/48) and Seaside's Soccer Club (Men's founded 1982 and joined by Queenscliff Women's in 1991) merged in 2004 to form Harbord Seaside's United Football Club In 2020 Harbord Seaside's United FC changed their name to Harbord Football Club.

David Brennan

In line with the MWFA Ltd Constitution, MWFA Director Joseph Sorbara forwarded a proposal for David Brennan to be nominated as a Life Member to the MWFA Board for their consideration.

The MWFA Board has nominated David Brennan to be elected as a Life Member by Special Resolution at the 2022 AGM.

Background David was Vice President Juniors on the MWFA Management Committee from 2006 until 2019, when the new Board structure commenced. In this role David was passionate about ensuring decisions made were in the best interests of all junior participant's enjoyment. This included participation, inclusiveness, fairness in competitions and making changes when required to keep younger players in the game longer.

David has continued to be an active and essential member of the Grading Committee. He has actively led the Grading Committee, including the preparation of the grading protocols and information that has been essential in improving the information available to assist the Grading Committee. David dedicates significant hours to this task covering all age groups that require grading from under 12's right through to the oldest age groups and includes all grades and divisions. David also provides invaluable insight and analysis with the sub junior grades when it comes to regrading those teams for all age groups after the initial few rounds of the year.

David is a progressive thinker and has always upheld the MWFA ideals to improve the experience of all players, young or old, Premier League or Division 8 as his primary goal while being unafraid to propose new or different ideas, no matter how different they are from custom and practice.

David has been on the Committee at Wakehurst FC for 15 years, since 2008 as Vice President - Youth and now also Treasurer. He's also been Competition Secretary. David has also been a key part of the reestablishment of the Wakehurst Summer Football competition. David has used the Summer Football competition to test the sum of his innovative ideas such as the Swiss System which is a round-robin-style tournament where rather than each competitor playing every other competitor, each competitor plays only other competitors that have won a similar number of games.

David has an enviable coaching record at Wakehurst FC, winning many Major & Minor Premierships, two State Cups and two Champion of Champions. He has also coached two teams in the same year at least 8 times. David's commitment and dedication to the game of football is deserving of being awarded life membership of the MWFA. Terry Gatward asked if anyone wanted to speak for or against David's nomination.

Greg Dick (President, Wakehurst FC) spoke in support of the nomination in that David Brennan epitomises everything that is good about grassroots football. David Brennan is as much, if not more, interested in lower divisions as he is in Premier League and if there were more people like him it would be wonderful.

Jeff Smit

In line with the MWFA Ltd Constitution, MWFA Director and Life Member Linda Ward forwarded a proposal for Jeff Smit to be nominated as a Life Member to the MWFA Board for their consideration.

The MWFA Board has nominated Jeff Smit to be elected as a Life Member by Special Resolution at the 2022 AGM.

Jeff Smit has played, coached, managed, refereed, sponsored and been on the committee of either a local soccer club or MWFA for the past 30 years. Jeff started playing for Curl Curl in the Under 6s and continued to play with them for 17 years. He played senior football with Cromer, Collaroy Plateau and one year with Long Reef. He has played PL for Pittwater, Wakehurst and St. Augustine's. Jeff moved to the Central Coast in 1989 where he joined Killarney District Soccer Club. He played in their senior team and the boys started playing in their Under 5s competition. He coached one of their teams each year and joined the committee and was the Senior President. He also ran the canteen and was on field set up most Sundays.

On his return to Sydney in 1998 Jeff settled in Frenchs Forest, near Lionel Watts reserve, hence Wakehurst became his new club. It didn't take long before he was running the Hews Parade Canteen and then the Bantry Bay Road canteen. Jeff coached or managed one or two of his children each season. He played goalkeeper for the Premier League. He was also on the Wakehurst committee and assisted with all the grading days and team allocations. His sons went to St. Augustine's. Again, he took on canteen duties and ran the Grahams canteen for several years. Jeff was St. Augustine's Registrar for a few years (until the school took over the role), he also assisted with the gradings, team allocations and coached a team for a number of years.

Jeff started refereeing when he became a Cadet Referee at 14 years old, a branch entrant at 16 and then onward to complete his Level 2 certificate and referee all grades including Premier League.

Jeff became Vice President of MWFA in 2006 and held that position until he became President in 2015, a position he held for 5 years. Jeff has also served as a Member of the Manly United FC, Manly Warringah District Soccer Football Club Boards as well as numerous committees both with MWFA and Football NSW through his position.

In 2019, as a Committee Member of the Manly Warringah District Soccer Football Club, Jeff became the major driver in the re-development of the Cromer Park Clubhouse facility. Which came to fruition with its re-opening in October 2021.

Suzy Broughton – Harbord FC

Suzy has been a key player, committee member, volunteer and driver of Harbord Football Club, stretching back to the early 1990's.

She started as a player, manager and coach of the Seaside Football Club Women's All Age team that won the MWFA Women's Premier League 12 times between 1991 and 2003 as well as three Football NSW State Cups and six Football NSW Champion of Champions titles.

In 2003, Seaside Football Club merged with Harbord Diggers Football Club to become Harbord Seaside United, and they have since undergone a name change to become Harbord Football Club. Since 2003 Suzy Broughton has been the heartbeat of the football club, holding positions of age coordinator, registrar, secretary, canteen manager, gear steward, coach (teams from U10s through to senior women) and competition secretary.

Like many grassroots clubs, Harbord Football Club survives on the goodwill and drive of volunteers and Suzy picks up everything that falls through the cracks. Quite simply the small community club of Harbord Football Club would struggle to exist without her.

Not only is Suzy a dedicated volunteer but she is also an incredibly knowledgeable and balanced football administrator, who's ability to consider the entire sport and put "football first" is highlighted by her position on the MWFA Competition Committee.

In 2009 Suzy was awarded the MWFA Meritorious Service Award for her work with Harbord Football Club and the Manly Warringah Football Association.

Alan Glixman – Seaforth FC

Giuseppe took on the role as Sub-Junior Coordinator.

Giuseppe was also instrumental in managing one of the first FKFC teams to attend the coveted Kanga Cup International tournament in Canberra.

In 2016 he was the manager of the very first Forest Team to win Kanga Cup in the under 14's age group. He continued to manage this same team which went on to win two (2) FNSW champion of champions and various MWFA competitions.

MWFA Women's World Cup Tournament Report

In 2023, Australia and New Zealand hosted the Women's World Cup tournament between July 20th – August 20th, 2023, across 10 different cities with a record-high of 64 matches played. To celebrate this event, the MWFA ran our own Women's World Cup at Cromer Park.

The MWFA invited our 16 clubs with women's programs to enter a team in both the U8 & U11 age groups for a series of games, run just like the World Cup.

Tournament Details:

Games were all played on Cromer Park 1 on the same days that the Matildas and the Ferns competed. The Far Post was open all competition nights, showing all games on the big screen for players to enjoy. Each team were drawn as a country at the MWFA Women's World Cup draw night hosted at The Far Post. All players received medallions for participation in the tournament, all semi-finalist received a voucher for a meal at the Far Post and the winners of each age group received official FIFA Women's world cup scarfs.

The MWFA were grateful to receive grants from the FNSW Legacy Fund in partnership with the Office of Sport as well as the Northern Beaches Council. This amount totalling \$10,500.

Coach and Referee Development:

The aim of this event was to boost the interest of football amongst young females in the Manly Warringah area and create an unforgettable experience for all participants while also increasing referee and coach numbers amongst young women. This tournament was a great opportunity for young females to learn a new skill and try a new aspect of the game they love.

Coach Development Manager, Eugene offered a two-day coaching education program for players interested in coaching a 'World Cup team'. This was offered to players who are passionate about acquiring new coaching skills in a non-competitive environment.

The grant funding was used to put the twelve females listed below, through the MWFA Referee course, each of them refereeing at the tournament and regular season matches (total regular season matches listed beside their name). All have been a great addition to the membership of the MWFA and their goal to have all games covered during the regular season in 2023. MWFA hope all referees continue their journey in 2024 and beyond.

2023 – Football does the talking!

How good was it to complete the 2023 season without any major disruptions after three years of COVID-19 and last year's rainstorms.

Football matches and the cut and thrust of games was the focus of the year and it was great to see 20,000 players get through the week-to-week season and take part in the Football NSW competitions.

On top of that, in the space of 12 months we won a record six Champion of Champions Competitions from 11 finalists, hosted the Football NSW State Cup Finals (and won 5 titles), hosted a Liberty W-League match, hosted a Pararoos International against the USA, watched 12 local players from MWFA Clubs and Manly United represent our National Teams and while the world's focus was on Australia for the Women's World Cup we hosted a successful Mini World Cup to help inspire local girls to drive a passion for football and a Live Site that saw 2,000 at Cromer Park for the Matildas' World Cup semi final against England.

It has been an incredibly busy, successful and satisfying season for all levels of our game on the Northern Beaches.

And we should all (players, coaches, families, clubs, volunteers and administrators) sit back and reflect on not just the last 12 months but the structure and environment we have in place on the Northern Beaches that allows this type of success at every level of our game.

At a time when the world is screaming ahead at 100 miles an hour and patience and humility is constantly tested, we should take a step back and admire and revel in what we have collectively built and what we collectively continue to drive and enjoy.

2023 saw us increase players numbers to 19,068 and as always, the key drivers to our structure and success are our volunteers across all 17 clubs and the MWFA. It is these volunteers (coaches, committee members, BBQ helpers, gear stewards, groundsmen, team referees, registrars and managers) that are the lifeblood of our game.

A lot of people put in a lot of effort to be able to coordinate the MWFA Clubs and competition and we could not do what we do and enjoy our weekend football matches without you.

I would like to thank the dedicated MWFA staff for their work in 2023. To Lee-Anne Sestanovich, Angela Crandell, Eugene Lawrenz, Alysha Rowe, Eric Subijano, Anthony Pavlidis and Sigrid Mulherin (MWFRA), thank you for your work throughout the year.

I'd also like to thank the MWFA Directors, David Wilson, Dave Anglicas, Rhonda Ferguson, Terry Gatward, Joseph Sorbara and Linda Ward for their support and hard work over the last 12 months. So much work goes into running the MWFA Competitions and you were all a huge help.

The MWFRA, led by Toby Williams, played a significant role in our season and continue to be an enormous stakeholder in our game and asset to the competitions. 2023 saw us all work together to collectively grow referee numbers through a few shared initiatives and that will continue into 2024.

No referees. No game. It's something we need to constantly remind ourselves of.

I would also like to extend a Thank You to the members of the various Committees that assist with the running of our competitions. The Competition Committee, Registration and Grading Committee (including our two Registrars Annette Burgoyne and Peter Auld), Disciplinary Committee and Appeals Committee all functioned well in 2023.

A big Thank You to anyone who attended The Far Post at Cromer Park as it continues to grow and long may it continue to be a hub for local football.

Profits from the Club's operations will again be split 50/50 between the MWFA and Manly United.

Grand Final Days were a huge success in 2023 with all three days full of memorable matches as we crowned the winners of all competitions across the men's, women's, girls and boys competitions.

The Women's Premier League Grand Final saw Manly Vale return to the top of the tree defeating Wakehurst 3-0 in the decider after both teams knocked off higher-placed sides in the semi finals. A special mention to Seaforth for taking out the Premiership.

The Men's Premier League Grand Final was an entertaining battle that eventually saw Narrabeen etch their names on the trophy after a dramatic 4-3 penalty shoot out win over Pittwater, who had previously taken out the Premiership.

Forest Killarney won promotion back to the Men's Premier League and took out the Men's AL1 Grand Final 2-0 over Wakehurst while Brookvale defeated Mosman 2-1 in the Women's AL1 decider.

Earlier in the year, Pittwater (men's) and Seaforth (women's) won the MWFA Challenge Cup Finals; both clubs taking out the Challenge Cup/Premiership double.

The season was capped off with the 2023 Football NSW Champion of Champions and it will go down as the most successful Champion of Champions tournament for any Association in NSW in the history of the competition.

MWFA teams took part in 11 of the 17 Champions of Champion Finals with the MWFA claiming 6 Title. Both achievements were Football NSW records and is a stunning illustration of the power of our competitions and the work of all 17 Clubs.

The success warrants individual accolades for our 2023 Champion of Champions.

Pittwater won the Men's All-Age defeating West Pennant Hills-Cherrybrook 5-2. The Pitts rolled their opposition early to lead 3-0 before finally prevailing 5-2 thanks to a double from Josh Yeates and goals to Riley Kilpatrick, John Walker and Odin Seoane Racano.

Seaforth claimed back-to-back titles in the Women's All-Age competition, defeating Jamisontown Giants 3-1 in a dominant display with goals coming through Michelle Le Roux, Hannah Griffiths and Kristina Reisinger.

The matches saw Chris Wood take out a unique double as he was Head Coach for both Men's and Women's teams after taking the reins at Pittwater mid season.

Brookvale won the U21 Men's competition after beating Cronulla Seagulls 2-1 in a tense final thanks to strikes from Luca Ball and Thomas Sims.

Forest Killarney won the Women's Over 30s Final, hammering Epping Eastwood 8-2 with striker Karka Ray scoring 5 and further goals to Erika Alker (2) and Stacey Beer. The win was even more impressive as the team played the regular season in the MWFA Women's O40/1 competition.

The **Wakehurst** U15 girls team were equally as impressive, leading from start to finish to defeat Lilli Pilli 4-0. The girls led 2-0 after 8 minutes and pulled away with Jessica Clagnan scoring a hat trick and Kiera Gard notching the 4th.

The **CC Strikers** Girls 14s team were our youngest winners and they started the ball rolling on Finals day by thumping East Gosford 4-1 thanks to an Erin Dunne double and goals to Lily Gibbons and Kaitlinn Dune.

Our Champion of Champions Runners up in 2023 were:

BTH U13 boys, who went down 5-4 to Horsley Park. Goals to Kye Kearney, Luke Wicks (2) and Cooper Gray were not enough as they fell to a long-range Golden Goal in the last minute of extra time.

Forest Killarney U15 boys lost to Banksia Tigers 2-1. After a slow start the Forest team came screaming home but a goal from Beau Alcock was not enough.

The **Pittwater** U16 girls fell short of winning consecutive Champion of Champions, losing 2-0 to Lindfield, a team they also faced in the Champions Cup a few weeks earlier.

Wakehurst were unlucky runners up in the Men's U18 final, falling 1-0 to Cronulla Seagulls with a late long-range goal in difficult windy conditions.

The **Manly Vale** U18 Women's team also fell at the last hurdle, beaten 3-0 by Shell Harbour FC, the identical scoreline and opponent from the State Cup Final earlier in the year.

The unprecedented success was acknowledged by Football NSW.

Leading into the Champion of Champions tournament, the MWFA and Northern Suburbs Football Association contested the "Champions Cup" with the MWFA retaining both trophies – men's and women's.

With three points for a win and one point for a draw, the MWFA won the men's competition 19-10 and the women's title 13-10.

Midway through the season, Cromer Park hosted the Football NSW State Cup Finals as Valentine Sports Park was used as a Women's World Cup training centre, and MWFA teams took part in 7 of the 14 finals, claiming 5 wins.

Such was the success of local teams in the State Cup that two games were all-MWFA affairs in the Women's All-Age and Girls U13s while MWFA clubs played in all 5 women/girls finals.

Ours State Cup winners were:

- Women's All Age: **Seaforth**, who defeated Beacon Hill 1-0
- Girls U16s: **Pittwater**, who beat Northbridge 2-1
- Girls U13s: **BTH**, who overcame Pittwater 1-0
- Boys U13s: **BTH**, who won 4-2 against Kellyville Colts
- Boys U15s: **Forest Killarney**, who triumphed 3-1 over Banksia Tigers

There is a huge amount of football played and it is important to thank and acknowledge the Northern Beaches and Mosman Councils for the work they do to assist as much as possible given their difficult pinch point of balancing sportsfield usage with ground maintenance.

This year we benefitted from the finalization of a number of projects to upgrade fields with Kitchener Park and Passmore Reserve both receiving new upgraded lights and new storage units were built at Beacon Hill Oval, Millers Reserve, David Thomas and John Fisher.

While the 2023 Player Numbers increased by 35 to 19,069 there is no doubt we will see a surge in numbers for the 2024 season with the 20,000 limit sure to be tested following strong growth across Summer Football competitions.

The MWFA would like to acknowledge and congratulate Manly United Football Club for the 2023 season.

The U13 and U16 Boys Youth League teams made the semi finals (a top 4 format from 16 clubs) with the U16s falling just 1 point short of claiming the Premiership behind the Newcastle jets.

In the Association Youth League, the U13, U15, U16 and U18 teams all made the semi finals with the U13, U15 and U18 teams going down in the Grand Finals.

All four of our Girls Youth Teams (U14, U15, U16 and U18s) finished one place out of the finals in 5th position.

The staff, coaches, volunteers and Board work hard to ensure we have a clear and vibrant pathway for the 500 local juniors who play for Manly United and MWFA representative teams and its role in proving local players with a talented player pathway that this year bore remarkable fruit.

As well as performing strongly across competitions in the Boys Youth League, Girls Youth League, Association Youth League and men's/women's seniors, we collectively celebrated the sight of 12 local players representing Australian (and New Zealand) National Teams.

That is an incredible illustration of the collective strength of our united football ecosystem; Lewis Miller (Pittwater) and Gianni Stensness (CC Strikers/Pittwater) played for the Socceroos Remy Siemsen (BTH) played for the Matildas

Ally Green (Harbord) played for the New Zealand Senior National Team

Jake Holman (Seaforth), Calem Nieuwenhoff (Curl Curl), Patrick Wood (CC Strikers) and Cam Peupion (Wakehurst) played for the Olyroos (U23s)

Kahli Johnson (Dee Why/CC Strikers) and Shay Holman (Seaforth) played for the Australian U20s

Nathan Barrie (Seaforth) played for the Australian U17s (Joeys)

Sienna Dale (Wakehurst) played for the Australian U17s

All 12 came through the local MWFA competition to Manly United and beyond.

A special mention to Cameron Peupion (Brighton & Hove Albion) and Remy Siemsen (Leicester City) who earlier this year made their English Premier League debuts. A wonderful achievement for both players.

At present there are a further 10 local players playing in the A-League Men and A-League Women's squads. They are:

Finance Report

The operating loss of the Company before development levies for the financial year ended 30 September 2023 amounted to \$99,837 (2022: \$120,419 surplus) prior to net development levy funding. In 2023, an additional net \$157,122 was collected for the Facility and Sportsfield development fund as compared to \$151,748 in 2022. The Company is exempt from income tax.

The key points to note in this year's results are: -

- Player numbers in 2023 increased marginally to 19,069 from 19,034 in 2022. Given the disrupted seasons 2020 and 2021 for COVID and the wet weather in the 2022 season, these player numbers were in line the Board's expectations.
- We have not increased the fees for the last three years as our members have had to contend with two seasons of disruption through COVID in 2020 and 2021 and unprecedented rain in 2022 and we have tried to absorb any increases in costs.
- However, in 2023, we have seen significant cost increases, particularly for: -
 - o \$68,421 in wage and administration costs due to increased staffing and in general administrative costs.
 - o \$74,655 increase in referee's fees due to the completion of a full season matches.
 - o \$99,504 increase for sportfields hire, particularly for Mosman Council and the back payment/accrual of training ground costs for Mosman FC for 2020-2023 that had been budgeted in each year for but for which we hadn't received the invoices for until this year.
- These cost increases were partially offset by higher interest income of \$60,764 due to the significant increase in interest rate received for our funds on deposit and the donations from Manly Warringah District Soccer Club and Manly Warringah Football Club, totalling \$30,000 arising from the new clubhouse operations.

Net Asset Position

The MWFA's net asset position has continued to improve as a result of the improved trading result, with net assets now totalling \$3,017,826 (2022: \$2,960,541)

As at 30 September 2023, there was \$925,245 (2022: \$768,123) held in the Facility and Sportsfield development fund. This balance has increased as we received \$190,690 in development income offset by payments for field equipment payments for 1 storage shed and the upgrade of the Beacon Hill canteen in conjunction with the Northern Beaches Council. We have also spent \$61,710 in November 2023 for the purchase of new goals for Under 12 fields required for the 2024 season and beyond.

No additional funds were contributed to the Cromer Park Clubhouse in 2023. The MWFA investment in the Cromer Park building is protected by a Memorandum of Understanding that ensures that this investment will be secured by an increased mortgage over the Cromer Park Clubhouse building and land and an agreement that the MWFA will not pay any rent for the use of the offices at Cromer Park for the next 24 years. The final deed of agreement to formalise the Memorandum of Understanding is currently under review with Manly Warringah District Soccer FC and should be executed prior to 31 December 2023.

Given the extensive capital works that Northern Beaches Council have been undertaking on our playing fields, the MWFA Board continues to review of our strategic goals that will set the parameters for future budgets and use of the Facility and Sportsfield levies previously collected.

2024 Budget

Over the past 6 years, the MWFA has tried to keep fee increases to a minimum despite the constant increases in operating costs. The below table show the operating profit/ loss and total expenses that we have incurred and are budgeting for in 2024.

From 2018 to 2023, MWFA fees charged had only increased by 6% in total when compared to an increase in costs of 19%. However, based on the current budget, we are expecting an increase in costs of 7% due to higher FA/FNSW fees due to increasing costs, increased ground hire and increased administration costs that total \$223,336. As such the MWFA has had to increase MWFA fees between 5.35% to 11.7% as shown in Table 1.

Table 2 shows that since 2018, including the significant increases in 2024, the average increase has ranged between 0.7% and 3.44% per annum, which are largely due to increased FA/FNSW fees.

Coach Development Report

The 2023 season was a record year for Coach Development in MWFA, with 1,023 coaches supported across a variety of coaching courses and workshops, as well as training session and match visits.

This total does include a number of repeat customers, however this is also an indication of the positive experience that coaches have had when attending our courses, and the ongoing value they provide. Similarly, more than 70 coaches from outside of the Northern Beaches travelled to take advantage of the opportunity to attend our Coach Development events.

830 coaches in total attended 12 x MiniRoos courses, 5 x Skill and Game Training courses, 16 x Coach Workshops, 6 x Game Leader workshops, 2 x club-based coach meetings and 1 x C-Licence. This is the highest number ever achieved in our association, largely due to the high number of dates made available across different clubs and spread out across the entire season, providing plenty of follow up development opportunities to encourage long term learning.

We also doubled the number of training session and match visits compared to last season (200 in total) where coaches were provided with personalised mentoring with their actual team at their actual training session or game, which is the most effective way to help them learn 'on the job'. The feedback received from the Coach Mentoring being provided has been overwhelmingly positive.

Overall, 21% of coaches supported through courses and mentoring were females, which is also the highest percentage we've ever seen. This was partly thanks to us organising another successful female only MiniRoos coaching course, presented by female coach developers. Our 2022 Female Scholarship winners Nina Sallenave and Patty Faria also joined our team of Coach Mentors and worked closely with 4 coaches who really enjoyed and benefited from the direct and ongoing support, and hopefully we can expand this program next season.

The Future Coaches Program continued its successful run in 2022, with another 15 participants this time around who were taken through an intense personal development program to help each of them reach their potential and achieve their coaching goals, along with several special guests sharing their experiences and advice. We also ran a C-Licence late last year as well as another one early this year, with 30 coaches in total progressing through the first stage of the advanced coaching pathway, and Rich Lacey and Steve Hurd respectively on board as assistant presents. MWFA Coach Development Manager Eugene Lawrenz was obviously very satisfied with this outcome, after a very busy but productive year.

"It's great to see so many coaches keen to develop themselves for the sake of their players, and credit to all of them, especially those who've come back more than once. Slowly but surely, we are starting to see a difference being made with more players having a positive experience in the sport, with more engaging and game-realistic training sessions, and player-centered coaching. I would like to also express my thanks to all of the clubs who hosted and helped promote all of our events this season, as well as acknowledge the hard work and quality of support that was provided to coaches by my team, in particular the Coach Mentors: Gregor Agic, Marilinda Winter, James Mitchell, Sai van Wegen, Catriona Ormond, Nina Sallenave and Patty Faria."

The MWFA Coach Development team would like to wish every player, coach, club volunteer and parent a safe and happy holidays, and we look forward to seeing everyone again in 2024.

Coach development is an investment, not a cost.

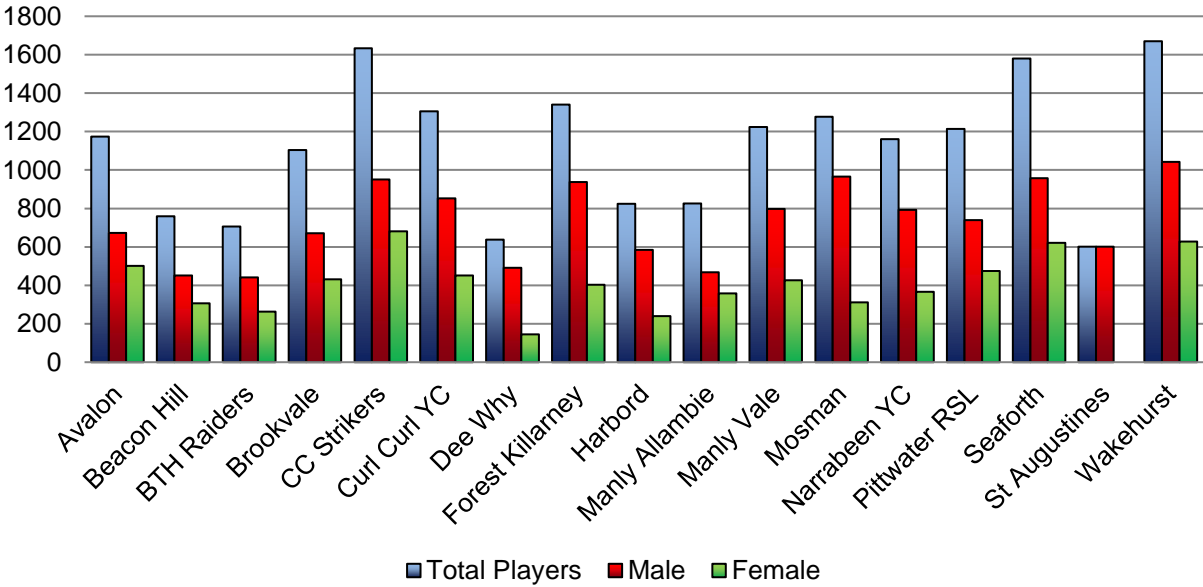

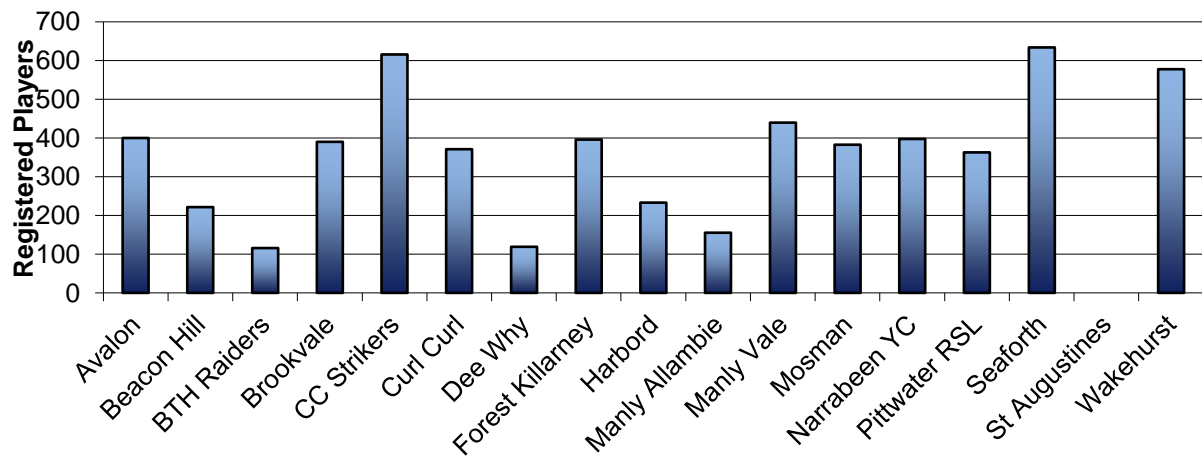
Total Players per Club 2023

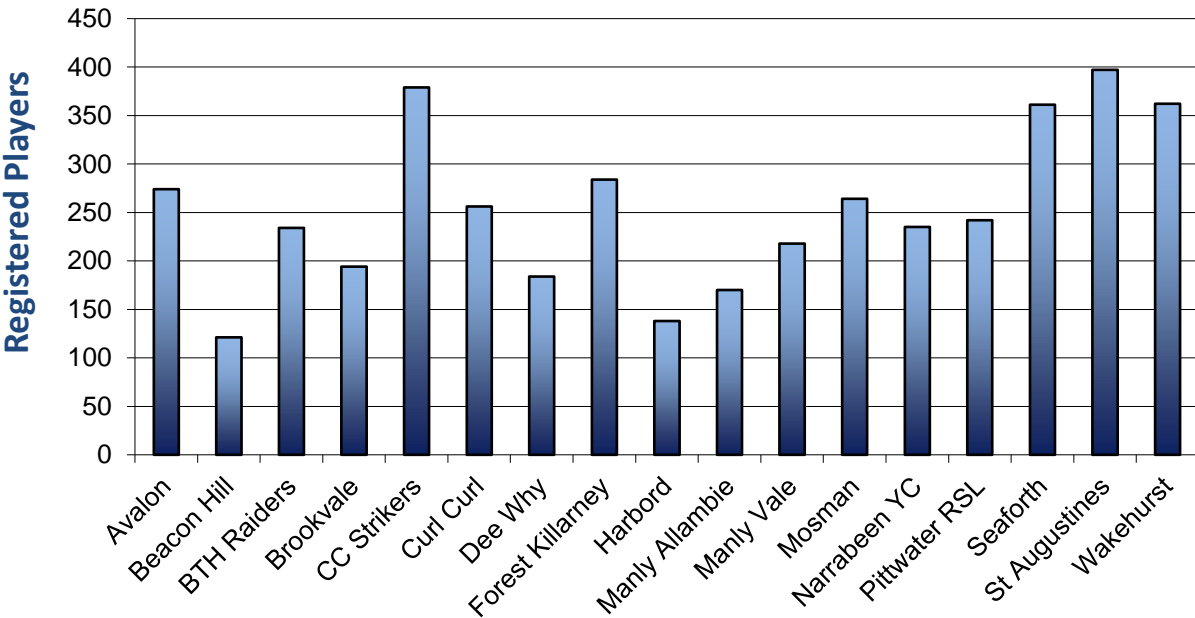

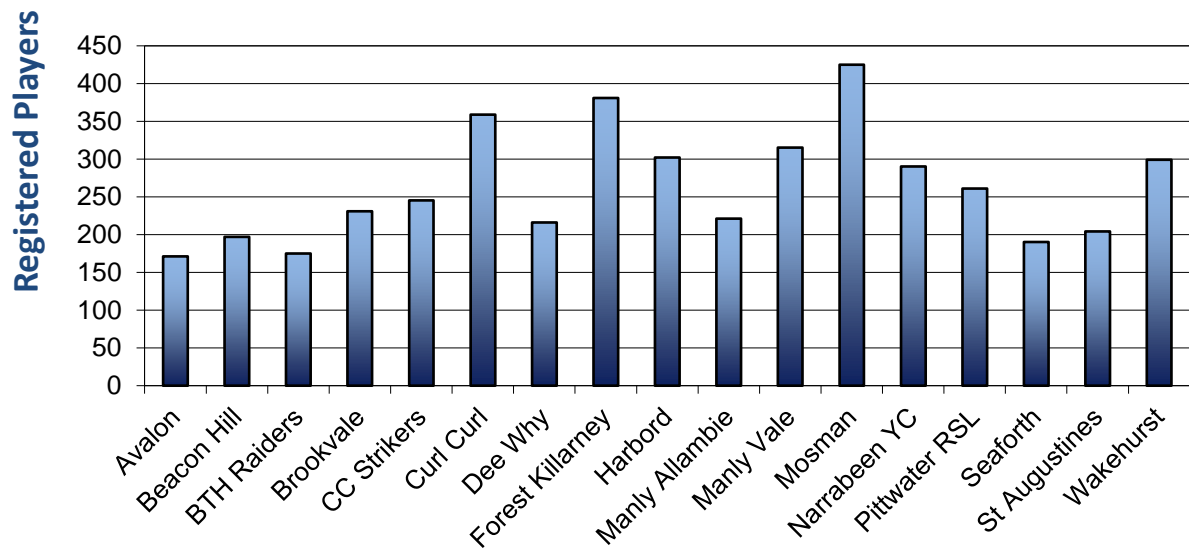

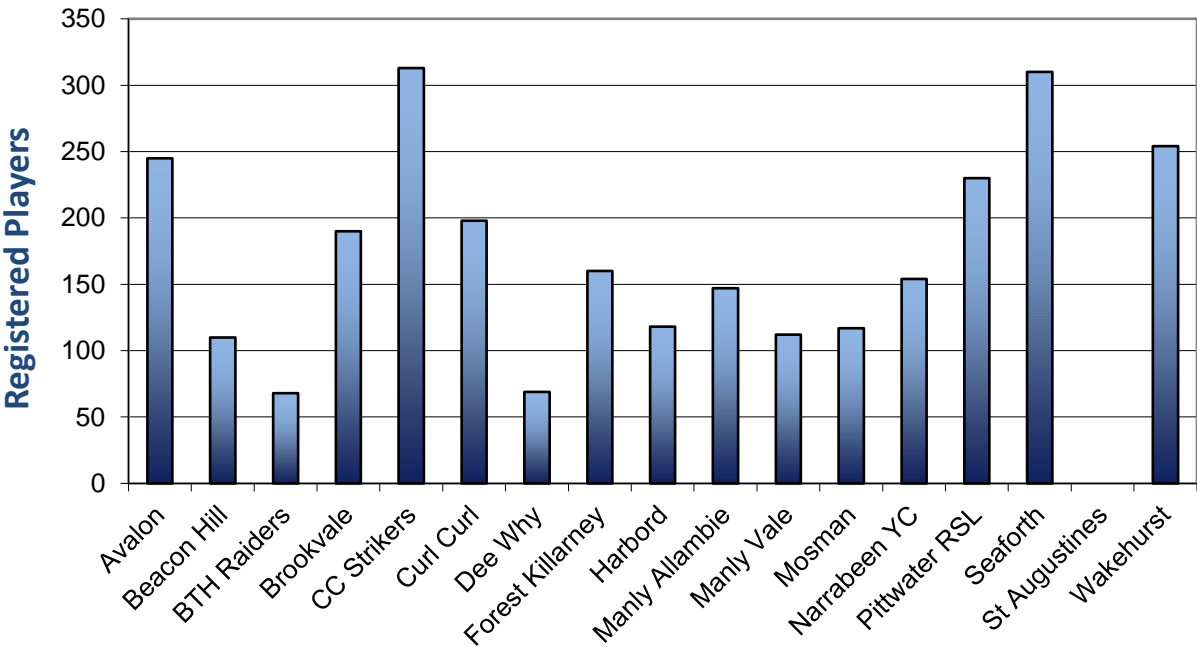
Total number of Senior Players (U18-All Age)

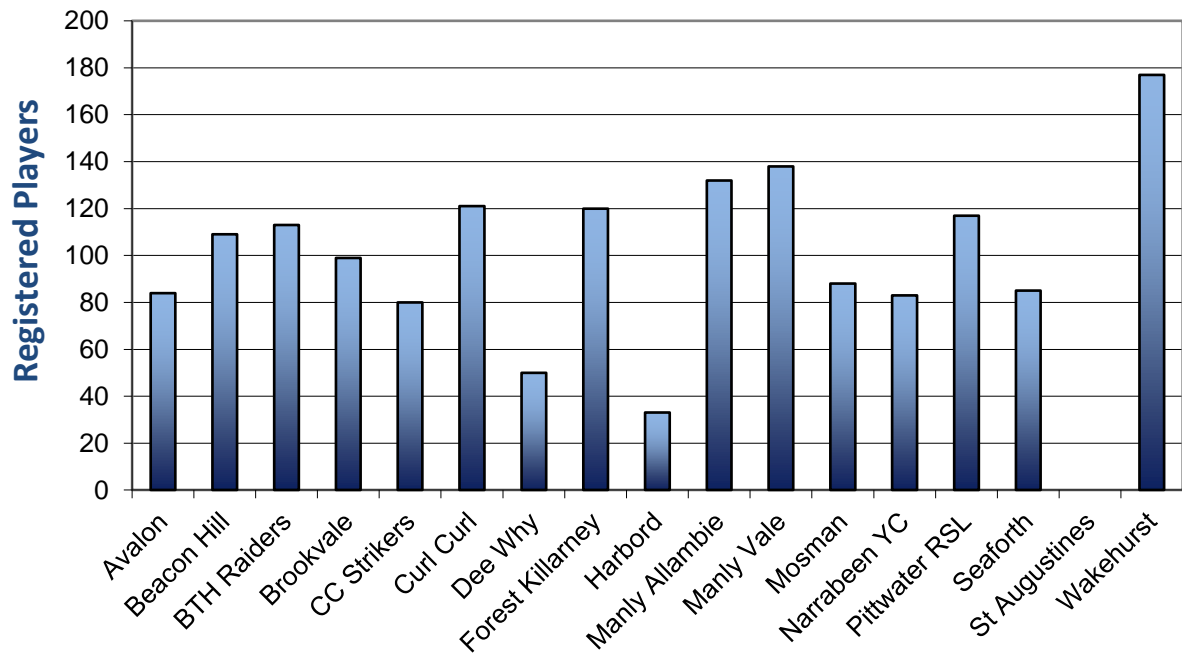
Total number of Junior Women’s Players (W10-W16)

(W18-WAll Age) registered per club in 2023

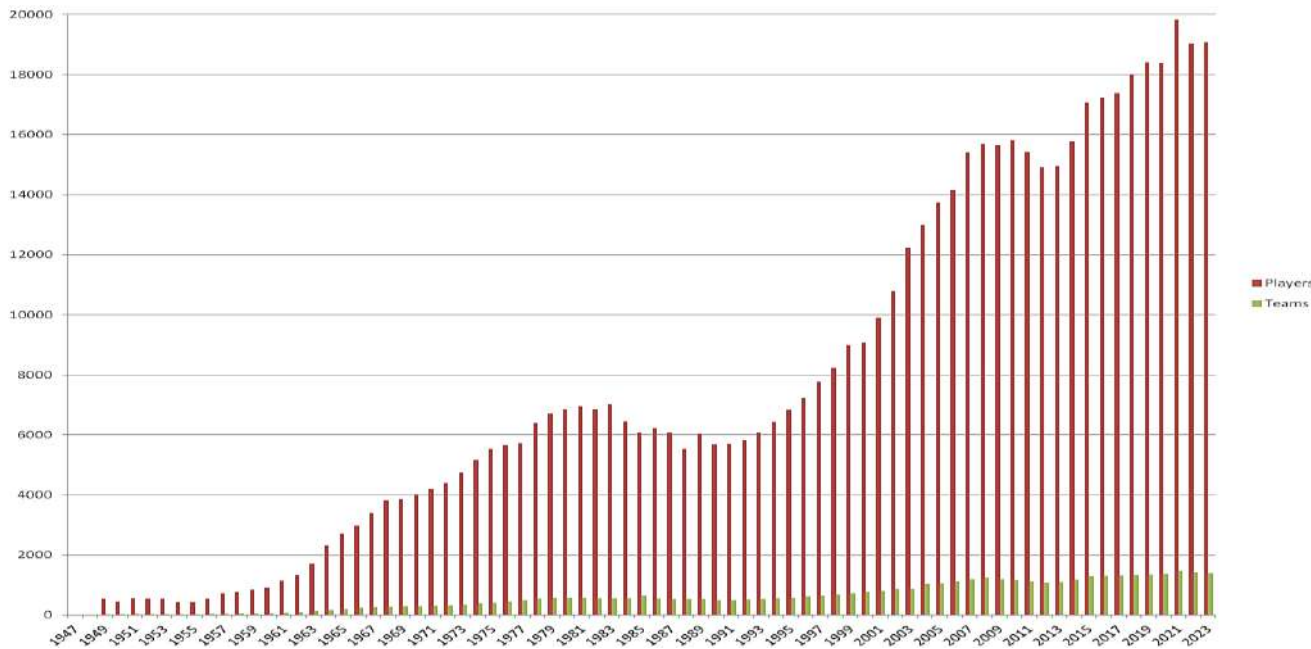

Manly United FC – Chairpersons Report

I would like to take this opportunity to give you an overview of what's happening at Manly United FC which is the representative arm of the MWFA.

As the largest Association in Australia, it's only natural that the MWFA should create a natural pathway for their most talented players to potentially play at the highest level either here in Australia or overseas and to represent their country where possible.

Over the many years I have been involved with Manly United it is satisfying to see the groundwork laid out many years ago finally coming to fruition with many players both male and female playing at A-League level or overseas in some of the most competitive leagues in the world.

Some of the players that have gone on to play are names that you know well or will know better in years to come. In the A-league Men's and Women's area players such as Jake Hollman (Macarthur / Seaforth), Corey Hollman (Sydney FC / Seaforth) and sister Shay Hollman (Sydney FC / Seaforth), Patrick Wood (CC Strikers / Sydney FC), Harry Van Der Saag (CC Strikers and Narrabeen / Adelaide), Aaron Gurd (Wakehurst / Sydney FC), Khali Johnson (Dee Why and CC Strikers / Western United), Oscar Priestman (Seaforth / Western Sydney Wanderers), Jasmin Black (Manly Vale / Sydney FC) and Sophie Harding (Harbord and Brookvale / Western Sydney Wanderers).

Other players to go on and play overseas include Cameron Peupion (Wakehurst /Cheltenham Town), Lewis Miller (Pittwater / Hibernian), Calem Nieuwenhof (Curl Curl / Hearts), Remy Siemsen (BTH / Leicester City), Ally Green (Harbord / AGF) and Gianni Stensness (CC Strikers / Viking FC).

It should be noted that many have gone on to represent Australia as well. The future looks promising with younger players Lewis Miller (Socceroos), Remy Siemsen (Matildas) Khali Johnson (Young Matildas), Sienna Dale (Junior Matildas), Shay Hollman (Junior Matildas) Jake Hollman & Calem Nieuwenhof (Olyroos) all being selected to represent Australia. Ally Green is also a member of the New Zealand National Team. We wish them well as they progress through the ranks.

Manly United play in the highest league in NSW called the NPL, as a Club we are up against some heavy hitters financially (Clubs like Olympic, APIA, Sydney Utd and Marconi). We work on very moderate budgets in both the Men's and Women's area compared to these Clubs as our charter is to develop players from within the MWFA footprint where possible and not to buy players to win the League or Grand Finals.

It's interesting to note that the model that was set up in the late 1990s with MWFA and Manly United tied closely together is now being followed by other Associations, in fact of the 15 Sydney metro Associations at least 13 of them now have affiliated representative Clubs, in fact of the 16 NPL teams in 2024 there will be 4 Association backed Clubs and 3 A-League Academy Clubs, I honestly believe this is the way forward in developing players for the future.

Manly United FC – Men's Report

Manly United FC commenced its 2023 journey under the stewardship of Technical Director Ian Crook, a distinguished former England international and the former technical director of Western Sydney Wanderers. However, Ian's tenure at Manly United FC proved to be fleeting, yielding to an opportunity ideally tailored to his expertise within a newly established role at the Football Australia (FA).

Within the increasingly competitive arena of the BYL NPL 1 division, Manly United's Boys Youth League encountered a challenging start, finding themselves nestled in the lower echelons of the Club Championship standings following the first half of the season.

Despite these initial setbacks, Manly United's youth teams stayed true to our systems and program and had a strong resurgence during the second part of the season, led by the U13, U16 and 18's squads, culminating in a respectable mid table (10th of 16 clubs) finish.

Notably, Manly United FC emerged as a strong presence in the top 4 championship playoffs with the U13, U16 and U18 teams featuring in the top 4 playoffs, with only Western Sydney Wanderers boasting a larger contingent in the final series.

Of particular note was the U16s, who came within one point of claiming the Premiership, which was ultimately won by the Newcastle Jets after a season-long battle between the two sides.

And while the U14s and U15s did not progress to the semi finals their improvement over the second half of the season was stark and sets the squads up well for 2024.

The need to overcome challenges is a necessary part of youth development and builds resilience, which is an important tool for all developing footballers, in fact developing young men and women.

In the Association Youth League sphere, one of the standout achievements of this season was the impressive performance of our U13, U15, and U18 teams. Against tough competition, these teams showcased their talent, determination, and commitment to the sport. They battled their way to the grand final, proving themselves as true contenders for the championship.

While all three teams fell at the final hurdle, their teamwork, skill development and dedication were driving forces behind their success, and we couldn't be prouder of these young footballers' achievements.

However, the story isn't just about the glory of reaching the grand final. Our U14 team, in a cruel twist of fate, narrowly missed out on securing a spot in the grand final. The final kick of the semi final decided their fate, highlighting the fine margins that exist in football. It's a testament to their hard work and resilience that they came so close, and their determination will undoubtedly fuel their future success.

Similarly, our U16s faced a challenging journey in the season, reaching the semi-finals but bowing out after a dramatic penalty shootout. This experience will undoubtedly serve as a valuable lesson, teaching them the importance of composure under pressure and the unpredictability of the beautiful game.

The SAP program once again shined due to the club's commitment to developing the young players' technical ability, which shows in their ability to outplay their opponents with Manly United's distinctive brand of football.

Both Manly United and MWFA SAP teams took part in the Sydney FC Cup during the season with some silverware heading back to Cromer Park through the Manly United U11 and U12 teams. All Manly United and MWFA SAP teams in the U11 and U12 competitions performed strongly against some of the best SAP NPL clubs, showcasing their potential and bright futures in the world of football.

In the Senior space, the first grade team found guidance under Patrick Zwaanswijk, a former Ajax and Central Coast Mariners player, who assumed the pivotal role of head coach.

Following an initial period of adjustment, the team exhibited exceptional displays, notably epitomized by a commanding 4-0 victory over this season's champions APIA Leichhardt. This victory, marked by the participation of several promising Manly juniors, underscored the club's remarkable depth.

The U20's squad, in parallel, enjoyed a stellar season, attaining noteworthy outcomes while concurrently nurturing emerging talents, thereby affording them invaluable first-grade exposure. The U20s took part in a Mini World Cup over 10 days at Homebush to assist referees in the lead up to the Women's World Cup and made the Final, going down to Marconi.

The season bore witness to the seamless integration of several Manly juniors into the first-grade playing squad, with Saxon Hillyer securing a first grade contract for his stellar season after cementing himself a position in the starting lineup.

A special thank you to the coaching staff for their unwavering dedication in guiding the gifted young footballers of the Manly United and the MWFA teams. It has been a pleasure working with you all and we are looking forward to continuing to help grow these young men and players we have in the SAP, BYL and AYL teams.

It's evident that this year has been a rollercoaster ride filled with ups and downs, moments of triumph, and heartbreak but it was an incredible journey these young footballers embarked upon.

One of the most fulfilling aspects of our program is the role we play in developing young talent. It's with immense pride that we can say a number of players progressed from the AYL into the BYL and from the BYL into A-League youth teams. This progression is a testament to the coaching staff's dedication and the hard work of these young footballers.

The lessons learned, friendships forged, and skills honed will serve as the foundation for these young footballers as they continue to pursue their dreams on the football pitch.

For some of these players it is into the Manly United senior teams, for others it is into NPL2 clubs and for many it is back into the MWFA system where they continue their football journey back where it started.

The future looks bright, and we can't wait to see what these talented young footballers achieve next.

Manly United FC – Women's Report

2023 saw the Manly United FC women's program field teams in the FNSW NPL Competition in grades 14, 15, 16, 18, Reserve Grade and First Grade.

This year, all 4 GYL teams finished 5th in a 14-team competition. The U16s missed out by one point on finishing 4th and the U18s missed out by two points on finishing 4th.

We fielded teams in U10, U11, U12, U13 in the FNSW GSAP competitions and under-pinned our GSAP program with 5 x Girls Development squads in grade U9, U10, U11, U12, U13.

13 of the 18-man First Grade squad this year were Manly United juniors and 3 members of the squad have secured W-League contracts with Melbourne City, Western United and Newcastle Jets.

Remy Siemsen (MUFC junior) was selected in the Matildas squad for the camp prior to the WWC and was very unlucky not to make the final cut.

Kahli Johnson was also a full-time scholarship holder with the Future Matildas program and a member of the Young Matildas. She has travelled overseas twice this year to play in all their matches.

Sienna Dale represented Australia in the Junior Matildas and in the final 2 games, of the most recent 3 game tournament in Vietnam, scored all 6 of their goals. She then went on to represent NSW at the National Youth Championships a week later where she was named the Player of the Tournament.

Season 2023 saw the introduction of our Individual Youth Development Program within our GSAP and GYL programs. We were very happy with the outcomes achieved and have plans to continue the program in 2024 with a few tweaks.

Our youth development programs, playing style, fair play, integrity, and facilities are second to none, along with highly qualified, experienced and dedicated coaching staff, which is why we are often referred to as the 'model' women's youth development program in NSW.

Once again, I consider myself fortunate to have held the position of Technical Director of the women's program at Manly United FC this year. Our players are a delight to work with from the SAP and Development Squad programs right through to First Grade.

Most of whom have learnt their trade at MUFC, many from as young as 10.

I know I speak for our coaching staff when I say that we are very fortunate to be charged with the responsibility of developing the best of the best on the peninsula and every year we work harder to do just that, whilst ensuring we have a balanced, nurturing environment where enjoyment and development is paramount, particularly in the youth grades.

Believing in what we do, not veering from the script and working together as a unit is why we are at the top of the women's game in NSW.

This year saw the 8th year of our Girls SAP (Skill Acquisition Program) and our 5th year of the full-time program in grades U10, U11, U12 and U13.

Our Girls SAP program is underpinned by four development squads for players registered in MWFA clubs – U10, U11, U12 and U13.

We have a commitment to developing home grown juniors so that our senior squad continues to draw from our youth grades both in the short term and in the future and the Girls SAP is certainly providing the best platform for this to continue.

We are in the business of developing elite footballers for Manly United and beyond, whether that be the W-League or National Teams and I am proud to say we are on track.

9.2 Jeff Smit

In line with the MWFA Ltd Constitution, MWFA Director and Life Member Linda Ward forwarded a proposal for Jeff Smit to be nominated as a Life Member to the MWFA Board for their consideration. The MWFA Board has nominated Jeff Smit to be elected as a Life Member by Special Resolution at the 2022 AGM.

Background

Jeff Smit has played, coached, managed, refereed, sponsored and been on the committee of either a local soccer club or MWFA for the past 30 years.

Jeff started playing for Curl Curl in the Under 6s and continued to play with them for 17 years. He played senior football with Cromer, Collaroy Plateau and one year with Long Reef. He has played PL for Pittwater, Wakehurst and St. Augustine's.

Jeff moved to the Central Coast in 1989 where he joined Killarney District Soccer Club. He played in their senior team and the boys started playing in their Under 5s competition. He coached one of their teams each year and joined the committee and was the Senior President. He also ran the canteen and was on field set up most Sundays.

On his return to Sydney in 1998 Jeff settled in Frenchs Forest, near Lionel Watts reserve, hence Wakehurst became his new club. It didn't take long before he was running the Hews Parade Canteen and then the Bantry Bay Road canteen. Jeff coached or managed one or two of his children each season. He played goalkeeper for the Premier League. He was also on the Wakehurst committee and assisted with all the grading days and team allocations.

His sons went to St. Augustine's. Again, he took on canteen duties and ran the Grahams canteen for several years. Jeff was St. Augustine's Registrar for a few years (until the school took over the role), he also assisted with the gradings, team allocations and coached a team for a number of years.

Jeff started refereeing when he became a Cadet Referee at 14 years old, a branch entrant at 16 and then onward to complete his Level 2 certificate and referee all grades including Premier League. Jeff became Vice President of MWFA in 2006 and held that position until he became President in 2015, a position he held for 5 years.

Jeff has also served as a Member of the Manly United, Manly Warringah District Soccer Football Club Boards as well as numerous committees both with MWFA and Football NSW through his position.

In 2019, as a Committee Member of the Manly Warringah District Soccer Football Club, Jeff became the major driver in the re-development of the Cromer Park Clubhouse facility. Which came to fruition with its re-opening in October 2021.

	<p>Terry Gatward congratulated the MWFA Office staff (Alysha, Lee-Anne and Sophie) on the presentation of the Annual Report, noting that it is an important record of history of the operations of the business of football.</p> <p>The 2022 Annual report also included the 2022 Financial Report.</p> <p>Terry Gatward called for a motion that the Annual Report be accepted by the meeting. This was motioned by Toby Williams, and seconded by Greg Dick. THE</p> <p>MOTION WAS CARRIED BY MEMBERS</p>	
Item 11	Presentation of the 2022 Financial Report	
	<p>Joseph Sorbara reported that Paul Turner and Michael Ellis, Auditors, had formally signed off the accounts with the MWFA showing a profit of \$120,419 before Development Levy (\$272,167 after Development Levy). Due to the season severely impacted by rain, this allowed for savings in referee fees and other cost savings to provide the final result. \$750,000 had been set aside from COVID payments from 2021, of which \$717,979 had been given back to all players via discounted fees for 2022 season.</p> <p>After review and recommendation of the financial statements to the Board, they show the MWFA Ltd to be in a robust financial position, with currently \$2,000,000 cash reserves, including \$760,000 approximately in the Development Levy, investment in the building considered a significant asset worth approximately \$1,000,000. There were also end of year liabilities that have been paid such as Northern Beaches Council ground hire fees and end of season fees that had not been paid by the end of September.</p> <p>The Board reflected on this position to form its view on the budget for next season.</p>	
Item 12	Adoption of 2023 Budget (including consideration of Honorariums)	
	<p>Joseph Sorbara stated the Board had reflected on the prepared financial statements to form its view on the budget for next season, including the aim to keep fees unchanged. However, after discussing initiatives for the 2023 season this was not achievable for all players with Football NSW and Football Australia increasing their fees and some alterations to the referees' fees for different age groups. On an operating level it is projected there will be a loss of \$163,000.</p>	

	<p>Funds will be utilised to assist MWFA in recruiting senior referees. It is worthwhile noting that Football NSW will remove registration fees for referees. \$10,000 will be used to target recruiting senior referees.</p> <p>There have been some fee increases in other areas from Football NSW and the FFA which will be passed on. The budget also allows for expenses associated with the 75th anniversary celebration of the MWFA. Accrual costs, including legal fees, are included in the budget.</p> <p>Other points to note are the \$25,000 dividend from the Manly Warringah FC and Manly Warringah District Soccer FC as part of the Memorandum of Understanding that any profits from The Far Post would be shared equally between MWFA and Manly United FC (after retaining some funds for maintenance costs).</p> <p>Player numbers were expected to remain at 19,034 though this may increase due to the Men's World Cup this year and the Women's World Cup in 2023. Growth in female player numbers may materialise the following season in 2024.</p> <p>Development Levy funds would be used for small storage sheds, lights at Passmore Oval, and an allowance for nets and goals to be used by Clubs. David Mason confirmed lights at Passmore would be ready by the start of next season.</p> <p>Overall, the budget has been prepared with the aim of maintaining cash reserves at \$2,000,000.</p> <p>After considering FFA and Football NSW fee increases for all players, referee costs for Premier League competitions (both Men's and Women's) and all age competitions have been adjusted. Men's PL fees to increase by \$24 (\$4 to FFA and Football NSW and \$20 for referee fee adjustment) and Women's fees to increase by \$18.90 (\$4 to statutory bodies and \$14.90 for referee adjustment). There will be no increase for all age Women's and Men's, and O/35s, O/40s and O/45s competitions. This reflects referee coverage.</p> <p>Costs of administration would remain the same as previous year, with the aim of reducing the cost of football as much as possible. Honorariums will be in line with 2022.</p> <p>Joseph recommended the proposed budget to the Board, which had been accepted. Joseph and David Mason had worked closely to prepare the budget to focus on referee initiatives, coaching, staffing levels and it reflects what the CEO would like to be delivered.</p> <p>Joseph Sobara moved that the 2023 Budget, including consideration of Honorariums, be adopted. This was seconded by Guiseppe Guerrero.</p> <p>THE MOTION WAS CARRIED BY MEMBERS</p>

Principal activities

The principal activity of Manly Warringah Football Association Limited during the financial year was to promote and encourage the development of playing football in the Manly Warringah area for both men and women.

The underlying operating loss of the Company before development levies for the financial year amounted to \$99,837 (2022: \$120,419 surplus) prior to net development levy funding. The Company is exempt from income tax. The operating loss achieved this year was due to a number of key elements being:

- The MWFA fee has remained largely unchanged since 2018 with the MWFA absorbing costs despite having to contend with two seasons of disruption through COVID and unprecedented rain in 2022. Following years of financial stability and prudent expenditure through growth, we were able to lean on our increases in reserves to absorb the increases on costs in previous years.
- These increases included \$68,421 in staff and administration costs, \$74,655 increase in referees fees due to the completion of a full season and a \$99,504 increase in money payable to use the fields., particularly for Mosman Council and the back payment/accrual of training ground for Mosman FC for 2020-2023.
- These cost increases were partially offset by higher interest income in 2023 (\$60,764) due to the significant increase in interest rates in 2023 and the donations from Manly Warringah District Soccer Club and Manly Warringah Football Club, totalling \$30,000.
- Moving forward we plan to correct the loss by reducing some costs, increasing fees (for the first time in 5 years), taking advantage of increased interest rates on our retained earnings and utilising the benefit of donations from the Manly Football Group.

The net profit for the Company for the financial year was \$57,285 (2022: \$ 272,167)

No significant changes in the nature of the Company's activity occurred during the financial year.

Operating results

Events after the reporting date

No matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the financial year which significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the Company, the results of those operations or the state of affairs of the Company in future financial years.

Environmental issues

The Company's operations are not regulated by any significant environmental regulations under a law of the Commonwealth or of a state or territory of Australia.

Contributions on winding up

In the event of, and for the purpose of winding up of the Company, the amount capable of being called up from each member and any person or association who ceased to be a member in the year prior to the winding up, is limited to \$10, subject to the provisions of the Company's constitution.

1. Introduction

The financial report covers Manly Warringah Football Association Limited as an individual entity. Manly Warringah Football Association Limited is a not-for-profit proprietary Company, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

The functional and presentation currency of Manly Warringah Football Association Limited is Australian dollars.

The principal activities of the Company for the year ended 30 September 2023 was to promote and encourage the development of playing football in the Manly Warringah area for both man and women..

The financial report was authorised for issue by the Directors on 27 November 2023.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

The Company is an entity to which ASIC Corporations (Rounding in Financial/Directors' Reports) Instrument 2016/191 applies and, accordingly amounts in the financial statements and directors' report have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

2. Basis of preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards - Simplified Disclosures issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') and the *Corporations Act 2001*, as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

3. Summary of significant accounting policies

a. Income tax

The Company is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

b. Borrowing costs

All borrowing costs are recognised as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

c. Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the Statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

d. Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recognised initially on the date that the Company becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

i. Financial assets

All recognised financial assets are subsequently measured in their entirety at either amortised cost or fair value, depending on the classification of the financial assets.

Classification

On initial recognition, the Company classifies its financial assets into the following categories, those measured at:

- amortised cost
- fair value through profit or loss - FVTPL
- fair value through other comprehensive income - equity instrument (FVOCI - equity)
- fair value through other comprehensive income - debt investments (FVOCI - debt)

Financial assets are not reclassified subsequent to their initial recognition unless the Company changes its business model for managing financial assets.

Amortised cost

The Company's financial assets measured at amortised cost comprise trade and other receivables and cash and cash equivalents in the statement of financial position.

Subsequent to initial recognition, these assets are carried at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method less provision for impairment.

Interest income, foreign exchange gains or losses and impairment are recognised in profit or loss. Gain or loss on derecognition is recognised in profit or loss.

Trade receivables and contract assets

Impairment of trade receivables and contract assets have been determined using the simplified approach in AASB 9 which uses an estimation of lifetime expected credit losses. The Company has determined the probability of non-payment of the receivable and contract asset and multiplied this by the amount of the expected loss arising from default.

The amount of the impairment is recorded in a separate allowance account with the loss being

recognised in finance expense. Once the receivable is determined to be uncollectable then the gross carrying amount is written off against the associated allowance.

Where the Company renegotiates the terms of trade receivables due from certain customers, the new expected cash flows are discounted at the original effective interest rate and any resulting difference to the carrying value is recognised in profit or loss.

Other financial assets measured at amortised cost

Impairment of other financial assets measured at amortised cost are determined using the expected credit loss model in AASB 9. On initial recognition of the asset, an estimate of the expected credit losses for the next 12 months is recognised. Where the asset has experienced significant increase in credit risk then the lifetime losses are estimated and recognised.

ii. Financial liabilities

The Company measures all financial liabilities initially at fair value less transaction costs, subsequently financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

The financial liabilities of the Company comprise trade payables, bank and other loans and lease liabilities.

e. Adoption of new and revised accounting standards

The Company has adopted all standards which became effective for the first time at 30 September 2023, the adoption of these standards has not caused any material adjustments to the reported financial position, performance or cash flow of the company.

4. Critical accounting estimates and judgements

The directors make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

a. Key estimates - impairment of property, plant and equipment

The Company assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions specific to the Company that may be indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

5. Revenue and other income

a. Accounting policy

i. Revenue from contracts with customers

The core principle of AASB 15 is that revenue is recognised on a basis that reflects the transfer of promised goods or services to customers at an amount that reflects the consideration the Company expects to receive in exchange for those goods or services.

Generally, the timing of the payment for sale of goods and rendering of services corresponds closely to the timing of satisfaction of the performance obligations, however where there is a difference, it will result in the recognition of a receivable, contract asset or contract liability.

None of the revenue streams of the Company have any significant financing terms as there is less than 12 months between receipt of funds and satisfaction of performance obligations.

ii. Statement of financial position balances relating to revenue recognition

Contract assets and liabilities

Where the amounts billed to customers are based on the achievement of various milestones established in the contract, the amounts recognised as revenue in a given period do not necessarily coincide with the amounts billed to or certified by the customer.

When a performance obligation is satisfied by transferring a promised good or service to the customer before the customer pays consideration or the before payment is due, the Company presents the contract as a contract asset, unless the Company's rights to that amount of consideration are unconditional, in which case the Company recognises a receivable.

When an amount of consideration is received from a customer prior to the entity transferring a good or service to the customer, the Company presents the contract as a contract liability.

iii. Other income

Other income is recognised on an accruals basis when the Company is entitled to it.

a. Objectives, policies and processes

The Board of Directors has overall responsibility for the establishment of the Company's financial risk management framework. This includes the development of policies covering specific areas such as foreign exchange risk, interest rate risk, liquidity risk, credit risk and the use of derivatives.

Risk management policies and systems are reviewed regularly to reflect changes in market conditions and the Company's activities.

The day-to-day risk management is carried out by the Company's finance function under policies and objectives which have been approved by the Board of Directors. The Chief Executive Officer has been delegated the authority for designing and implementing processes that follow the objectives and policies. This includes monitoring the levels of exposure to interest rate and foreign exchange rate risk and assessment of market forecasts for interest rate and foreign exchange movements.

The Board of Directors receives monthly reports which provide details of the effectiveness of the processes and policies in place.

Mitigation strategies for specific risks faced are described below:

b. Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk arises from the Company's management of working capital and the finance charges and principal repayments on its debt instruments. It is the risk that the Company will encounter difficulty in meeting its financial obligations as they fall due.

The Company's policy is to ensure that it will always have sufficient cash to allow it to meet its liabilities as and when they fall due. The Company maintains cash and marketable securities to meet its liquidity requirements for up to 30-day periods. Funding for long-term liquidity needs is additionally secured by an adequate amount of committed credit facilities and the ability to sell long-term financial assets.

Liquidity needs are monitored in various time bands, on a day-to-day and week-to-week basis, as well a rolling 30-day projection. Long-term liquidity needs for a 180-day and a 360-day period are identified monthly.

At the reporting date, these reports indicate that the Company expected to have sufficient liquid resources to meet its obligations under all reasonably expected circumstances and will not need to draw down any of the financing facilities.

The timing of cash flows presented in the table to settle financial liabilities reflects the earliest contractual settlement dates and does not reflect management's expectations that banking facilities will be rolled forward. The amounts disclosed in the table are the undiscounted contracted cash flows and therefore the balances in the table may not equal the balances in the statement of financial position due to the effect of discounting.

c. Credit risk

Credit risk refers to the risk that a counterparty will default on its contractual obligations resulting in a financial loss to the Company.

Credit risk arises from cash and cash equivalents, derivative financial instruments and deposits with banks and financial institutions, as well as credit exposure to wholesale and retail customers, including outstanding receivables and committed transactions.

The credit risk for liquid funds and other short-term financial assets is considered negligible, since the counterparties are reputable banks with high quality external credit ratings.
